Once upon a time, there was a pirate named Little Miss Chan. Whenever she was scared, she would jump!



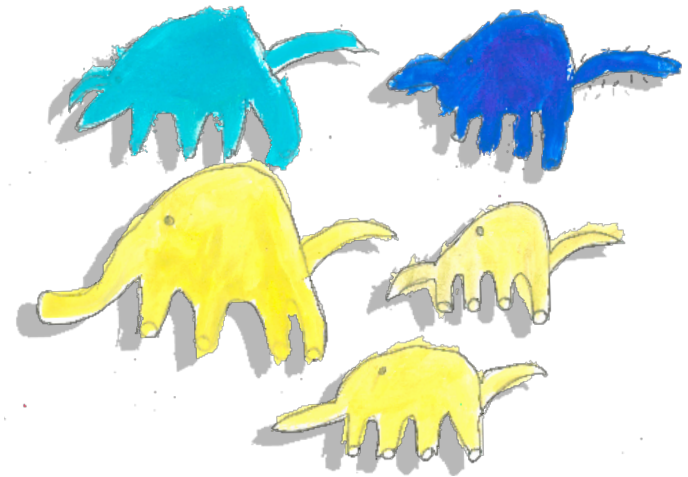

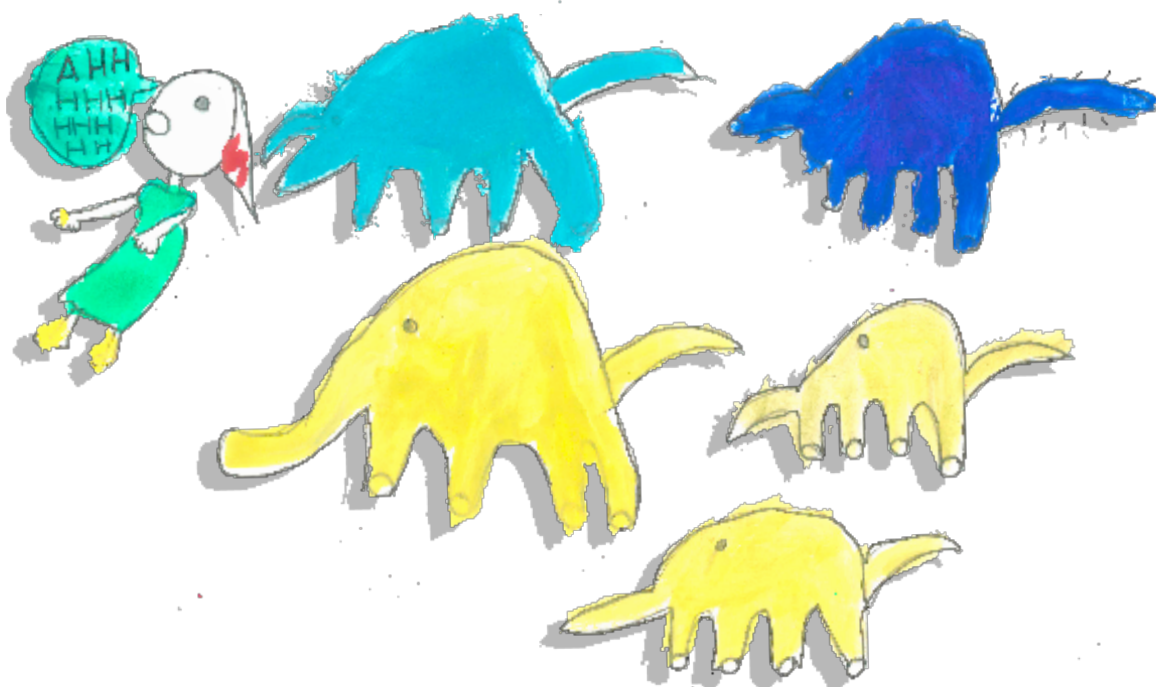


Five Tall Elephants

It is big. It is pink.

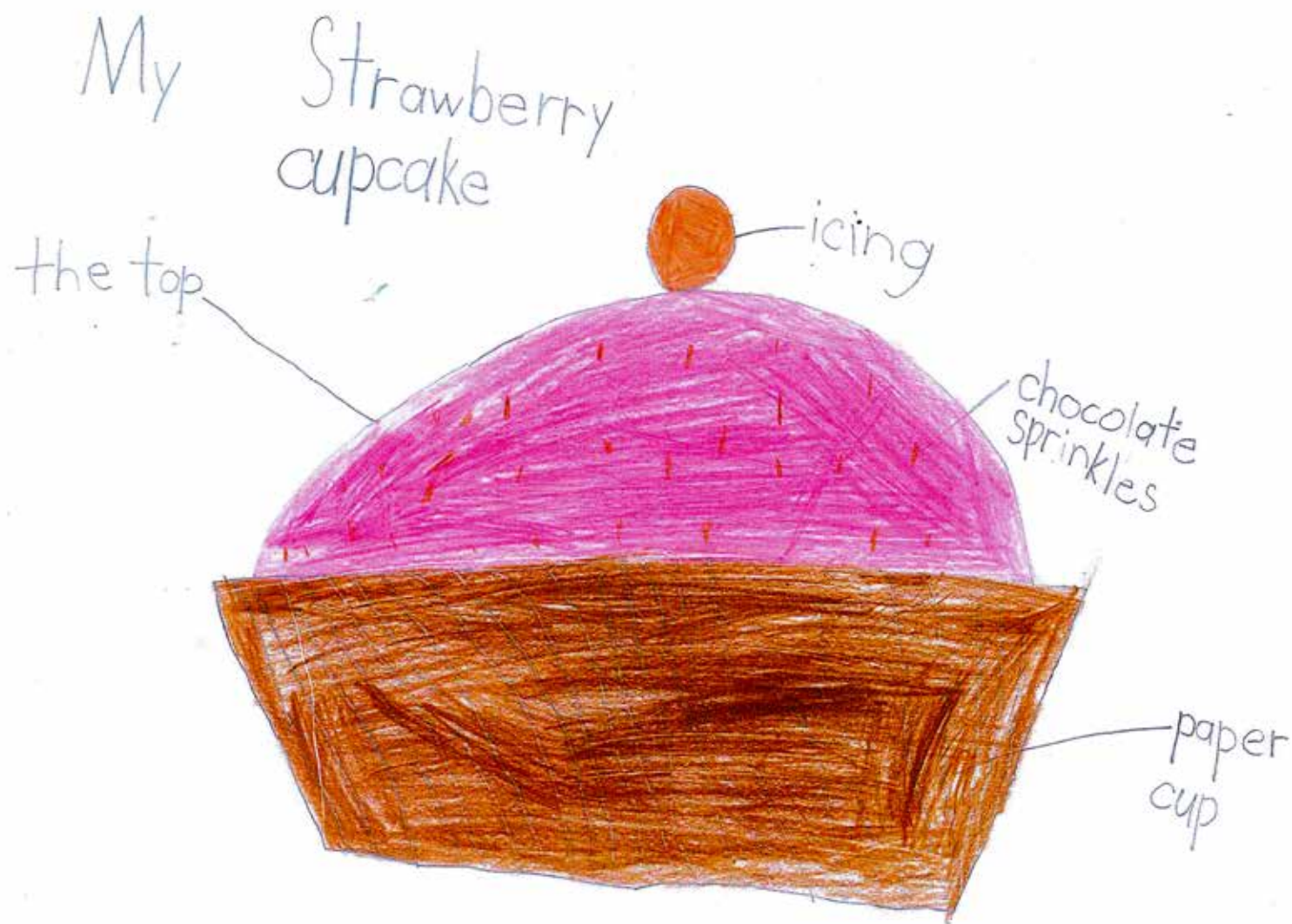
It is like a boat. But it is soft.
